### Course Description:

This challenging but rewarding class will begin by looking briefly at the price that was paid to obtain American liberty. We will then study the character and original writings of many Founding Fathers and the intent of the Constitution as well as, the US Constitution, paying particular attention to what really is there and what is not there. The second half of the class will historical and biblical concepts of economics. We will study the increasing involvement of government in the economy and the impact of policy decisions on the economy. Weekly research and discussions of how current events reflect on the material that we are studying will also be part of the grading process. Students should read and comprehend at upper-high school level and be prepared to research and hand in weekly homework assignments, including essays (some instructions on essay, research and writing will be included).
